## **ARKAN's First 1836 Awards to be Awarded** Bill Smith, K1ARK

Robin Norris, AD5JA, and Randy Baggett, KG5NE, to receive first 1836 Awards

ARKAN is proud to issue 1836 Awards #001 and #002 next week to Robin Norris (AD5JA) and Randy Baggett (KG5NE). The 1836 Award was designed as a stepping stone toward the Worked All-Arkansas Award sponsored by the club for persons who have confirmed contacts with all 75 Arkansas counties.

The 1836 Award is based on one of the earliest state maps of Arkansas, when the newly minted state had only 36 total counties. A contact with any modern day county that is a part of the 1836 county counts toward the award. For example, 1836 Washington County was composed of both Benton and Washington counties on modern maps.

Robin and Randy are the first to turn in their worksheets for the honor, but hopefully the first of several.

#### Norris and Baggett earn first "native" WAA

Along with their 1836 Awards, Robin Norris and Randy Baggett also submitted applications for Worked All-Arkansas, and upon review by the WAA award chair have been issued certificates #004 and #005.

These are significant because they are the first in-state awards issued to persons who began working on the WAA when the program began. The first three awards were issued to persons who had achieved County Hunter Awards or were on their way toward that award.

Robin gets #004, and the additional honor of earning the first in-state WAA thanks to her own efforts in supporting the Worked All-Arkansas Net each Saturday evening following the Razorback Net on 3.9875.

Both the WAA and 1836 Awards will be in the mail after next week's December meeting of ARKAN as outgoing club president John Robinson, KD5NFX, puts his signature on the certificates as one of his final duties.

Additionally, Bill Smith, K1ARK, the WAA awards chair, and Don Banta, K5DB, originator of the WAA net, are working on special recognition for Robin and her work as one of the regular net control operators for the WAA net.

#### 2005 Arkansas QSO Party results are in

Poor conditions led to much lower scores for the 2005 Arkansas QSO Party, but the good news is new logs came in from distant locations and considerable numbers of QSL cards sent in for Arkansas credit show increased interest.

The overall winner for top op was a battle of the Bills. Bill Smith, K1ARK, of Fayetteville, edged past Bill Gentry, KI7GV, of Prairie Grove by less than 2,000 points. Neither threatened the all-time score of 46,559 by Peg Porterfield, K5BKT, racked up in 2004.

Ronald Evans of Jonesboro, K5XT, took the top honors in the CW division while John Laney, K4BAI, of Columbus, Ga., was the top scorer from outside the state of Arkansas.

The top club honors remain open as we await logs from ARRL clubs for the event. The top in-state club becomes the bonus station for the next year's event. W5YM, the Amateur Radio Club of the University of Arkansas, relinquished its crown last year to Benton Amateur Radio Society.

Generally, the comments were for more Arkansas stations on the air – as usual – but most seemed pleased with the change of weekends off the Texas QSO. The contest chair is searching for a similar date for next year in early September, and is open for suggestions.
